

Visitors Guide & Rules

Parking

Vehicles may be used for offloading only.

After offloading, please move your vehicle to the designated parking area.

During Your Stay

- No smoking inside the accommodation
- No cooking inside the accommodation
- Please remove shoes before entering
- Ensure all doors and windows are closed when leaving and at night
- No loud music
- No abuse of alcohol or mind-altering substances
- Management reserves the right to remove any guest whose behaviour is disruptive, unsafe, or disrespectful to the space, other guests, or the land
- Please ensure your indemnity form is signed as part of the booking process
- All tap water on the property is safe to drink

Fire Safety

- Fires are only permitted in designated areas
- Fire pits may only be used when there is no wind
- All fires must be fully extinguished before night
- Braais may be used in designated braai areas only

This is a high fire-risk area, so extra care is essential.

What to Bring

Your yurt stay is designed to be peaceful, nature-based, and semi-self-sufficient.

- Food and snacks for your stay
- Picnic items
- Braai food and basic cooking supplies
- Potjie ingredients (if you'd like to cook over the fire)
- Ice (if needed)
- Firelighters and matches
- A gas stove or simple outdoor cooking setup (optional)
- Pots, pans, utensils, and crockery for outdoor cooking
- Warm clothing for the evenings
- Comfortable shoes
- Swimwear
- Swimming towels
- Toiletries
- Insect repellent

Please note:

- Shower towels are provided
- Swimming towels are not provided
- A cooler box can be placed in your yurt on request

Guests are encouraged to shop in nearby towns before arrival, as the experience is intentionally simple and not fully catered.

Outdoor Cooking & Self-Sufficiency

Guests are expected to manage their own meals and basic outdoor cooking needs.

You will have access to:

- Designated braai areas
- Fire pit areas
- A potjie
- Braai grids

You are welcome to bring:

- A gas stove
- A gazebo
- Any additional outdoor cooking equipment

We also have an organic garden on the land. Guests are welcome to harvest available seasonal produce on request at an additional cost.

Group Bookings

Bush Kitchen for Groups

When more than three accommodation spaces are booked, a bush kitchen can be set up for the group.

This may include:

- A fridge
- Gas stove
- Table
- Basic cooking equipment
- Charging station (on request)

Smaller or individual bookings will require a more self-sufficient setup.

What Is Provided

- Bedding and pillows
- Shower towels
- Basic lighting
- Power supply
- Floor coverings or rugs
- Access to braai areas
- Access to outdoor facilities

Fees & Guest Care

- Cleaning fee: R300 per stay
- Laundry service: R500 on request
- Firewood: R120 per bag

On Departure

- Strip the bedding and shower towels
- Leave them neatly folded by the door
